





Survey of Sonoma County Likely March 2024 Voters RE: Potential Sales Tax Measure Summary of Results - March 2023

Methodology



- Mixed-mode live telephone and email- and text-to-web survey
- Likely March 2024 voters in Sonoma County
- Survey conducted March 12 March 16, 2023
- 400 interviews; overall margin of error ±4.9 percentage points
- Telephone interviews were conducted by professional interviewers; landlines and mobile phones included
- Where applicable, results compared with the following:

Please note that due to rounding, some percentages may not add up to exactly 100%.

Key Findings



- About half of voters are optimistic about the direction of the County. Homelessness and fire protection are top concerns.
- Voters give high marks to local fire and emergency services and recognize the need for high-quality fire protection services, but are largely critical of the county's management of budget and finances.
- The initial vote for a sales tax hovers just below two-thirds, consistent with prior polling and election results.
- Support messaging, especially about oversight by local firefighters and chief and proactive fire protection efforts, resonates with voters, though does little to move support.
- The measure is vulnerable to opposition messaging, particularly that which focuses on its regressive and evergreen nature and the number of taxes already in place, but support remains above a majority.




Homelessness remains a top-of-mind problem for voters.



Issue Importance




Fire protection is a top concern for voters, along with homelessness.

Are you using any type of local fire alert system like Nixle or Watch Duty to get alerts about local fires in Sonoma County?




Ratings Over Time



Voters do not feel positively about the job Sonoma County is doing at managing its money.


The job the county government is doing managing its budget and finances



Sonoma County Voter Attitudes Over Time




While a third say they'd vote against any tax increase, voters recognize the need for high-quality fire protection services, even if it means raising taxes.

Ballot Language Comparison



There have been slight variations in the language of the ballot question over time.

07/2019 - POLL

To improve emergency medical services, provide improved wildfire prevention and protection, reduce response times for 911 emergency calls, and modernize fire protection equipment, shall the County of Sonoma establish a [Sample A: 1/2 / Sample B: 1/1 cent sales tax countywide for a 25year period, providing approximately [Sample A: \$45,000,000 / Sample B: \$23,000,000] annually, with citizens' oversight and annual audits?

12/2021 - POLL

To improve and enhance local fire prevention, protection, and emergency and disaster response throughout Sonoma County by: improving countywide vegetation management by reducing flammable brush to prevent wildfire spread; attracting and retaining qualified, local firefighters; and, updating firefighting facilities and equipment, shall Sonoma County establish a ½ cent sales tax until ended by voters, providing approximately \$51,000,000 annually, with annual audits and citizen oversight, and increase its annual appropriations limit to allow expenditure of the proceeds?

09/2019 - POLL



Sales Tax Measure




Initial support is well above a simple majority, but short of two-thirds.


Sales Tax Measure by Subgroups

Special Sales Tax Historical Context


½ cent sales tax

Measure Support Messages




Oversight by firefighters and chiefs is popular with voters, as is vegetation management and other proactive efforts.

ACCOUNTABILITY: All money raised by this measure will be spend here in local fire districts to provide fire protection and emergency response services. Strict financial accountability provisions, including oversight by citizens and local firefighters and chiefs and independent audits, will ensure money is spent properly, and that non is taken by the state or used for any other purpose.

VEG MANAGEMENT: This measure will fund critical vegetation management efforts which will create resilient landscapes making our community safer and reducing the likelihood of future wildfires. Reducing hazardous vegetation and maintaining fuel breaks is critical to reduce the risk of wildfires in our community and to help prevent wildfires from spreading into our residential and commercial areas.

CONTINUED BATTLE: With longer, hotter, and more volatile fire seasons, local fire departments need to be proactive in protecting our community from wildfires and helping save lives during dire-related emergencies. This problem isn't going away, and we must find a way to minimize the potential for fires and the impact they have.

FIREFIGHTERS – VOLUNTEERS: Many local firefighters are volunteers and in recent years volunteer numbers have been declining. This measure will provide the resources needed to attract and retain full-time employed firefighters to provide consistent and quicker response to all emergencies.



Measure Support Messages



Other messages are also convincing to about six in ten voters.


PARAMEDICS: When an emergency strikes, we want to know that help will be there for us or a loved one when we most need it. This measure will support hiring more emergency paramedics and medical personnel to more quickly respond to a variety of emergencies in our community, from medical emergencies to floods and fires.

EQUIPMENT: The fire engines, fire stations, and other equipment of local fire stations are becoming outdated and are at risk of breaking down. This measure would replace outdated firefighting engines and other emergency equipment, as well as update fire stations to allow for 24/7 staffing, resulting in faster response times and quicker handling of rescue situations.

FIRE CHIEFS: This measure was written by local firefighters and fire chiefs, who best know the challenges and needs for fire protection in our community. They believe the measure addresses a critical need facing Sonoma County and are coming together to gather signatures and generate community support.

FLOODING AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS: Severe drought, fires, and floods are all putting a strain on our emergency services. This measure will fund the staff, equipment, and other resources needed to ensure that emergency services are there promptly and fully prepared when you need them.

ONGOING FUNDING: This measure will provide an ongoing source of funding that our local fire departments can rely on. This will help with staffing and resource decisions to ensure we have the fire and emergency protection and response we need to stay safe in the years to come.



Opposition Message Convincingness



Opposition messaging about the number of taxes, and the evergreen and regressive nature of this measure, is convincing.


EVERGREEN: Most tax measures have an expiration date, but this measure is permanent with no end date. That means we'll continue to be taxed with no end in sight.

TOO MANY TAXES: Now is not the time for this major tax increase. Taxes in Sonoma County are already too high and we're already paying extra taxes for fire and emergency service. The County just needs to manage its money better and control overinflated pension costs.

REGRESSIVE: A sales tax is regressive and hurts those who can least afford it, including low-income families, seniors living on fixed-incomes, and those who have lost everything in the pandemic.

UTILITIES: The local utility company is the true problem and they're already increasing rates to address fire issues. They should be the ones paying for wildfire prevention, not us.

HOMEOWNERS: We should have to pay more taxes just because some people aren't maintaining their own property. They should be forced to get their properties under control, and we shouldn't have to pay for it.





Opposition messaging drives down support, but it remains above a majority.



Conclusions and Recommendations



- Initial support for the ballot measure matches historical data, hovering around two-thirds.
- Opposition messaging demonstrates a level of vulnerability. However, support remains above 50%.
- Voters recognize the need for strong local fire protection services and give high marks to their local fire departments. Framing this as the measure of fire fighters and fire chiefs, and not of the County, will be critical to its success.



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
